About the Canadian Birkebeiner Society Since 1985, the Canadian Birkebeiner Society has organized the largest classic cross-country ski event in Western Canada, on the second weekend of February, with participants from all over Canada and over the U.S. border.

The non-profit society aims to involve participants of all ages in cross-country skiing, promoting an active and healthy winter lifestyle. In addition to the Canadian Birkie Ski Festival, the Canadian Birkebeiner Society organizes other ski events to allow people to enjoy cross-country skiing in a friendly and fun atmosphere.

The Canadian Birkie Ski Festival allows participants to relive the Birkebeiner legend of how two Birkebeiner warriors rescued the future Norwegian Crown Prince by skiing him to safety in the middle of winter. In the longest race of the Canadian Birkie, skiers still carry a 5.5-kilogram weight that symbolizes the Crown Prince Haakon Haakonsson.
